Safety Tip of the Week

Protecting Your Identity

It's scary to think that almost every piece of paper you throw away could put you at risk. You can protect yourself, though. And it's easier than you think.

The best way to ensure that dumpster diving thieves don't gather enough information about you to steal your identity is to shred every piece of paper that you throw away. Shredding something doesn't mean to tear it into little pieces. It's also not wise to use a straight-cut shredder.

Straight-cut shredders cut paper only length-wise. With enough time and patience, a dumpster diver can put the pieces of your document back together, much like putting a jigsaw puzzle together. Your best protection is a cross-cut shredder. Cross cut shredders cut both length-wise and width-wise, creating confetti out of your personal information that is too difficult and time consuming for criminals to put it back together.

Dumpster diving is more a threat than you may realize. It's easy for criminals to get at your personal information if you just throw it away. So protect yourself. Shred everything.

Weekly Campus Crime Report

On Campus

Theft – *Athletic Center baseball locker room* – On Feb. 23rd between 3:39 PM and 5:15 PM, a senior undergraduate's gold ring was taken from an unlocked locker. The door to the locker room was unlocked. Investigation continuing.

Off Campus

ARREST- Attempted Theft – *3339 N. Charles St. (Charles Street Market)* – On Feb 23rd at 7:49 PM, an Aramark Manager reported a non affiliate male was stacking up property in the freezer to carry out of the store. When the suspect was told to put the property back, he hid in the restroom, and was found in the storage room by a Campus Officer. Baltimore Police, Campus Officers and off duty Baltimore Police working for JHU responded. The property was retrieved and the suspect was arrested and charged with Attempted Theft and Trespassing.

Burglary – *300 Block E. University Pkwy* – On Feb 22nd, a JHU senior reported that a high definition television was taken from his residence between 7:00 PM and 8:00 PM. During this time frame the senior was home alone on the 3rd floor and heard movement downstairs and assumed it was one of his roommates. At 8:00 PM the senior's roommate arrived at the residence and noticed the television was missing.

An unlocked, upstairs window was found open in a 2nd floor bedroom leading to a rear porch. The rear kitchen door was also unlocked. No other items were taken and nothing else appeared to be disturbed in the residence. A Campus Officer, an off duty Baltimore Police Officer working for JHU, and Baltimore Police responded. Investigation continuing.

Theft - From Auto – *2900 blk. N. Charles St.* – On Feb 23rd between 3:00 AM, and 6:10 AM, a non-affiliate reported that her parked vehicle's front driver side window was broken out and rummaged through. A gym bag, a pair of boots, various sets of sweatpants and sweatshirts were missing from her vehicle. A Baltimore Police and a Campus Officer responded.

Common Assault – 3000 Blk. N. Charles St. (east side) – On Feb. 27th at 12:31 AM, after two sophomore undergraduates had exited the 7-Eleven store at 31st & Charles Sts. an unknown female approached them, shouted at them, “What did you say to my man?” and struck each of them once with her fist. No injuries. The suspect was last seen walking eastbound on E. 31st St. Campus officers searched the area with negative results. Baltimore Police responded. Investigation continuing.
